#### Member Bio - Skip Hamer

My name is Skip Hamer. I joined the RCMC back in 1988 when the show was held at the old Mall parking lot. I've served as club VP then President so I've done my time. I currently own a 1993 5.0 LX convertible, but have previously owned 12 other Mustangs ranging from a 1965 coupe (first car) to a 2004 Mach 1. One of my hobbies is collecting diecast cars and Mustang artwork, my other hobby is bowling. I met my wonderful wife, Deborah, through our bowling league, in the fall of 2000 and we married 1 year later. One thing she did like to do, even though she said she wasn't much of a car girl, was to drive whatever Mustang we had at the time and the stories she would tell me when she would get home were a joy to hear. Seems every guy in town wanted to race her and she apparently wasn't too shy about doing it. Deb was diagnosed in the fall of 2006 with esophageal cancer, stage 4, and she passed away 17 months later. We were very grateful to the club for the January '07 Car Show they put on to help us financially. Though she is gone she will never be forgotten.

As I said before, my current Mustang is a '93 convertible and it was redone this past year in her memory. I bought the car back in the summer of 2005 with 112K miles. The motor was replaced with a Ford 302/340HP crate motor; I had a gear drive installed along with new BBK shorty headers, an Explorer intake and 65mm throttle body. The automatic transmission (Aamco transmissions) was rebuilt with a mild shift kit, a new steering rack; front cross drilled/slotted rotors and pads, new master cylinder, Russell braided lines and a new emergency brake cable were installed. The rearend was rebuilt and an aluminum differential cover was installed. All this work was done by my friend, Deron Shady. I also bought a complete set of '01 Cobra convertible seats off Ebay and had a new cloth top installed by Rod's Customs. The car was painted a two-tone, Black over Red, and a Saleen ground effect kit a rear spoiler were installed. So far the car has been on several trips without any problems.

Back to the club. I've enjoyed my years as a member and look forward to being one for many more.
